### LIQUOR LICENSE COMMISSION MEETING MINUTES

The Agawam Liquor License Commission held their monthly meeting on Wednesday, June 16, 2021, 6:30 p.m. at the Senior Center, 954 Main Street, Agawam, MA.

A public hearing was held for an application received for a change of manager at Ray-Mor, Inc. dba The Elbow, 386 Walnut Street, Agawam from Ronald Piteo to Raymond Rossi. Mr. Rossi was in attendance and assured the Commissioners he would be on site 55+ hours and there will be no changes. This application was approved unanimously.

A request for a One-day liquor license for a beer tasting fundraiser at The Captain Charles Leonard House, 663 Main Street, was discussed. The fund raiser will be held July 30, 2021 from 6 – 9 p.m. The Commissioners have some concerns regarding the application process and plan to create a more complete application to include TIPS certification and liquor liability insurance. This request was approved unanimously.

Discussion was held regarding outdoor dining and the serving of alcohol. The Commissioners agreed to extend the current policy until April 2022. They would like Casa di Lisa, Partners Restaurant and Take Five to apply for a permanent license for outdoor dining as they have permanent patios in place.

Discussion regarding a complaint received for under-age serving at Michael's Pasta in the Pan, this establishment does not hold a liquor license and the complaint is "hear-say", no action. Discussion regarding a complaint received for "selfies" at The Pour, concern that this practice may encourage under-age patrons. Industry standard allows for under-age eating at bars, so complaint dismissed, no action.

Discussion was held regarding "non-use" of the liquor license held at Quest, Inc. dba Catch 1251, 1251 River Road. The Commissioners would like a certified letter sent to Carmella Craig, President, that Catch 1251 must be "up and running" by October 1<sup>st</sup> of this year or they will begin the revocation process.
